 - (b) Analyse the relevance of the Ten commandments to Christians in Uganda today.
3. (a) Examine the significance of clean and unclean animals and insects as taught in Leviticus 11-1-47.
 - (b) To what extent does Jesus' teaching in Mark 7:1-23 concerning uncleanness agree with Leviticus?
4. (a) How did Nathan react to the sin of David with Bathsheba?
 - (b) What does this response teach about the role of religious leaders in society?
5. Assess the effects of the building of the Temple by Solomon on the people of Israel during his time.
6. (a) Why was Jerusalem besieged during Hezekiah's reign and not Ahaz's?
 - (b) Explain the lessons modern leaders can learn from these two kings.
7. (a) Who were the canonical prophets contravened the canonical understanding of God's prophets.
 - (b) Discuss the ways in which professional prophets and what was peculiar about their call and vocation?
