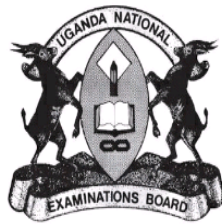

(b) Discuss the Christian teaching you would use to support the women's Liberation struggle.
3. (a) Discuss the purpose of marriage in traditional African society.  
  
(b) In what ways is this different or similar to the Christian understanding of the purpose of marriage?
4. (a) Examine the importance of children in traditional African society.  
  
(b) What evidence of responsible parenthood is there in the Bible?

### WORK, LEISURE AND MONEY

5. (a) With illustrative examples, explain the meaning of corruption.  
  
(b) Comment on the challenges a Christian would meet on a job where all his/her colleagues take corruption as a normal way of life.
6. (a) Discuss the factors that have contributed to the growth of a permissive society.  
  
(b) Explain the indicators or manifestations of a growing permissive society.
7. (a) Examine the consequences of people's greed for wealth in Uganda today.  
  
(b) Discuss the Christian teaching on wealth and prosperity.
8. (a) Discuss the various obstacles to economic growth in East Africa today.  
  
(b) Examine the ways in which the church can help to overcome these obstacles.

10. "The church and politics are inseparable ". Discuss.
