8. (a) Why was there hostility to Jesus at the feast of Deduction in John 10:23-24?

(b) Discuss the problems people meet in Uganda today in accepting Jesus as their savior.

(a) With reference to Paul's first letter to the Christians, Justify the above statement.

(b) Use this teaching to advice Christians today.

10. How does Paul develop the idea of Christian Freedom in his letter to the Galatians?

11. (a) Discuss James' teaching on the tongue and its relation to the causes of war.

(b) How does this teaching apply to society today?

12. (a) With evidence from I Peter, identify the audience the author had in mind.

(b) To what extent is the letter relevant to Christians in Uganda today?
