Tuesday Lesson: Grammar

Question tags

A question tag is a short question found at the end of a statement. It is used to check the correctness of the statement.

Note: When using question tags, please note the following.

-when statement is positive, the question tag must be negative

-when the statement y is negative, the question tag must be positive.

-a comma is used to separate the statement from the question tag to show the difference between the two.

Examples.

- 1. Mary went to church, didn't she?
- 2. Mary didn't go to church, did she?
- 3. Mukasa ate all the food, didn't he?
- 4. Mukasa didn't eat all the food, did he?

Active and passive voices in the past simple tense

Note: was/were + a past participle verb are used.

Examples.

1. Alex drank a bottle of soda.

A bottle of soda was drunk by Alex.

2. The children picked all the rubbish in the school compound.

All the rubbish in the school compound were picked by the children.

3. Cecil prepared a very delocious meal.

A very delicious meal was prepared by Cecil.
