- 2. (a) Evaluate the significance of extended family relations in traditional African society.
 - (b) Account for the decline of extended family relations in East Africa.
- 3. Compare the belief about the destiny of the Soul in African Religious Experience with the Christian teaching.
- 4. Examine the factors that hindered the fast spread of Christianity in East Africa.
- 5. (a) Explain the circumstances that led to the killing of Bishop Hannington in Busoga, Eastern Uganda.
- (b) Examine the impact Hannington's death had on the spread of Christianity in Uganda.
- 6. With reference to the history of the church in East Africa, assess the view that Johann Ludwig Kraft was a failure in his missionary work.
- 7. Discuss the differences between '1910 Edinburgh" and the other earlier Missionary conferences.
- 8. "There are conflicts between Christianity and traditional African Religions." Discuss.
- 9. (a) Explain the Buddhist teaching about the middle way.
 - (b) How similar is this teaching to the Christian idea of suffering?
- 10. (a) Analyse the factors which led to the emergence of independent churches in East Africa.
- (b) Suggest possible measures that Christian "Mother churches" can take to guard against divisions in their churches.
- 11. (a) Account for the rise of cults in East Africa.
 - (b) How can the church address the problem of mushrooming cults?
