- 5. Compare Ather with Hadith in the following areas:
 - (a) Reliability,
 - (b) Interpretation of the Qur'an,
 - (c) Authority.
- 6. The prophet said, "Leave what is doubtful to you in favour of what is not doubtful "reported by Tirmidhi, Explain the meaning of this.

SECTION B

- 7. "Ijma can never be obtained in a world where there are diverse opinions at any given time". Discuss.
- 8. Analyse the circumstances under which it became necessary to have divisions of legal acts.
- 9. Give the biography of Imam Hanbali with particular reference to his contribution to jurisprudence.

- 11. Explain the way a murder case can be handled by a Kadhi under the Islamic criminal law.
