1. Read the passage below and answer the guestion that follows.

A clash with a neighbour can make life hell. And if things turn sour between you and your neighbor, you may not be able to get away from the problem unless you move out of the house.

Noise next door can drive you mad. It could come from a barking dog or from non-stop, all night parties. If you can't bear it any longer, contact the Environment Health Department of your local council. You will need to prove that the noise stops you from enjoying your property or that it is making you ill. You will need proof, so keep a diary.

Many house and car alarms seem to go off for no reason at any time of the day or night. If this is a problem you can phone either the police or your local environment health officer. There is a new law which allows them to turn off a car alarm, and to enter premises to disconnect an alarm which keeps going off.

If your neighbour has the builders, then you have to put up with drills and cement mixers. There's bound to be some disturbance, but if you cannot bear the noise, or it is taking place at night, then you can take them to court to them stop work. This is called taking out an injuction.

If your neighbour's dog has bitten you or frightens you, you may want to take action, contact the local dog warden or the police or secure a court order that the dog is muzzled and kept on a leash. If a dog continuously enters and fouls your garden, the easiest thing to do is to put a fence!

The parking place right outside your house is not your property. You have no right to park there. However you have a legal right to enter your driveway or garage. Some local councils now operate parking schemes for residents. If your neighbours are always parking so that you cannot get out, call the police if you think their parking is illegal: it is in charge of traffic management and control.

If your neighbour fences off your land or starts to grow plants in what you think is your garden, then you have a problem. Arguments over land ownership are hard to solve. They can be sorted out in court but this could cost you a lot of money. You just have to decide how much money you have to spend.

Some disputes are about partition walls. These are walls built right up the boundary between homes. You and your neighbor are both responsible for this. You are not allowed to take fruit from a neighbour's tree just because the branches hang over your fence.

Many complaints are about neighbour's building extensions. People who wish to build extensions must have planning permission. The council must put up a notice at the site or write to all those who may be affected. Put your objection in writing and try to get other people to so, too.
