

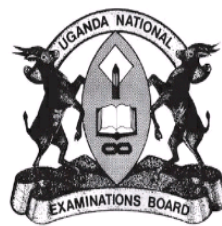

2. (a) Analyse the status of women in traditional African society.  
(b) How has the church in Uganda today tried to uplift the status of women?
3. (a) Discuss the causes of death according to traditional African society.  
(b) Compare these causes of death with the Christian teaching about death.
4. (a) Account for the problems the Christian missionaries faced in the early days of their work in East Africa.  
(b) How did they cope with these problems?
5. Discuss the missionary methods that were employed in spreading Christianity in the late 19<sup>th</sup> and early 20<sup>th</sup> centuries in East Africa.
6. Analyse the role played by Buganda in the spread of Christianity to the rest of Uganda.
7. (a) Assess the impact of missionary education on the traditional education in East Africa.  
(b) Examine the role of the church in education today.
8. To what extent should a Christian be involved in politics today.
9. (a) Discuss the words of God as seen in traditional African concepts.  
(b) How relevant are these words to Christians today?
10. (a) Analyse the main teachings of the Bahai faith.  
(b) What impact has the Bahai faith had on the peoples of East Africa?
11. (a) Account for the rise of the African Greek Orthodox church (Uganda Orthodox church).  
(b) Explain the slow rate of growth of this church in Uganda.
12. "Indigenization of Christianity in East Africa was inevitable". Discuss the above view, giving relevant examples.
