### Adverbs

Adverbs are words that tell us how, when, where and in what manner something happened.

### Examples of adverbs

often, now, slowly, quite, today, yesterday, rarely, usually, fast, slightly, very, long, then, here, quietly, hard, promptly, alike, outside, inside, today, sometimes, later, early, nicely, almost, less, much,

### Forms of adverbs

Adverbs of time ( When ) eg. always, rarely, sometimes, soon, later, now, early, today, yesterday, etc

Adverbs of place ( where ) eg outside, here, there, nowhere, somewhere, inside, near, far, etc

Adverbs of manner ( How ) eg, well, fairly, nicely, comfortably, poorly, proudly, loudly, happily, sadly, etc

Adverbs of degree ( to what extent ) eg very, almost, only, less, much, etc

### Formation of adverbs from adjectives.

Adverbs can be formed from adjectives in different ways. However, a majority of adverbs are formed from adjectives by adding ly to the adjective as soon below.
