Draw 4 balls

 \bigcirc Make groups of 2 out of the 4 balls drawn.

How many twos have you made / grouped?

There are 2 twos in 4.

<u>Therefore $4 \div 2 = 2$ </u>

b) 6 - (How many twos are in 6?)

Draw 6 balls and make groups of 2.



How many twos are in 6?

There are 3 twos in 6.

<u>Therefore 6 ÷ 2</u> = 3


