COMPARISON OF ADJECTIVES

There are three different levels of adjectives

- a. positive
- b. Comparison**

C superlative

Positive

This is when you are describing an item or person.

Example

1. Joel is a tall boy.
2. . She is a clever girl.
3. Nancy has a beautiful bag.

c. Comparative

This is when you compare two things or people.

Examples

1. Maxine is taller than Jacob.
2. An elephant is bigger than a giraffe.

c. superlative

This is when you are comparing more than two things or people.

Examples

1. An elephant is the biggest animal in the jungle.
2. Mary is the smallest girl in the class.

Adjectives that take er in comparative and est in superlative.

Examples
