FATAL: PASTOR DIES IN FORT PORTAL ACCIDENT, FIVE CRITICALLY INJURED

Police and Fort Portal Town residents look at the wreckage of a car and lorry that were involved in an accident on Lugard Street yesterday. Pastor Peace Luwoza of Kabarole Christian Fellowship Church, who was one of the six people injured in the accident, later died from Fort Portal hospital. Eyewitnesses said the lorry driver lost control, knocked the car, a boy riding a bicycle, before ramming into a stationary motorbike. Police spokesperson for Rwenzori sub-region Bakari Mugah Bashir, said they are hunting for the lorry driver who is on the run.
