- 4. (a) Examine the factors that favoured the Portuguese settlement at the East African Coast.
- (b) How did their settlement affect the already existing Muslim community?
- 5. "The means by which Islam spread in Uganda is different from the means by which it did in Kenya". Discuss.
- 6. Analyze the social- political conditions of Kenyan Muslims during the colonial period.
