- 4. Discuss the significance of the discourse on the lost things for Christians today. (Mark 13)
- 5. (a) The women were very good disciples of Jesus as reflected in the Gospels of Mark and John. Do you agree? Give reasons for your answer.
- (b) Today, women can effectively spread the good news. Comment on this assumption.
- 6. "Jesus appears to reveal Himself and his nature more in the Gospel of John than in Mark". Justify this view.
