Spread of Pan—Africanism in Africa.

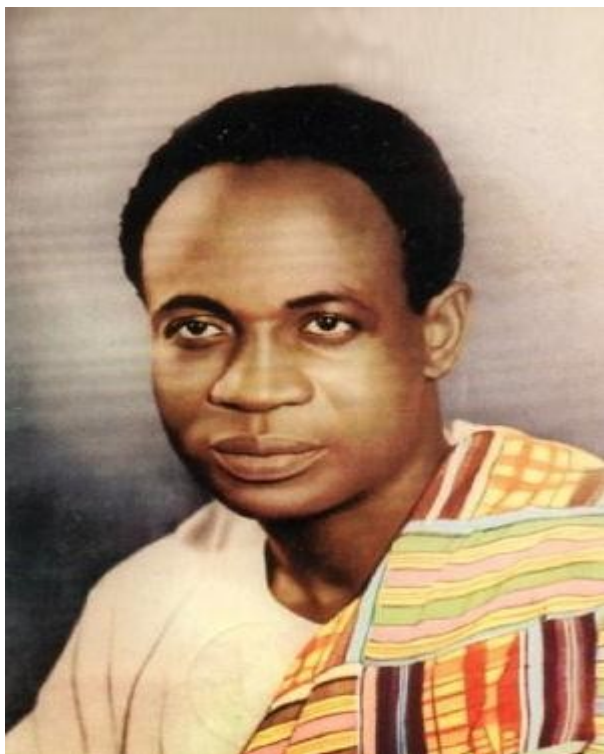

James Emman Kwegyir Aggrey



He was a learned Ghanaian who spread the ideas of Booker T Washington and encouraged Africans to value education.

Kwame Nkrumah



He was a Ghanaian who attained his education in Britain. While in Britain he was introduced to African nationalism and Pan—Africanism and met other nationalists and Pan—Africanists. He founded the Convention Peoples Party to demand for Ghana's independence. He organized the first Pan—African conference in Africa in 1958.
