10. To what extent was the 1978 Camp David Accord successful in resolving the Arab- Israel conflicts?

SECTION D: SOUTHERN ASIA AND THE FAR EAST

11. "The Yalta Conference was the beginning of a new era in the East - West relations". Discuss.
12. How did the war in Indo- China affect South Vietnam between 1954 and 1975?
13. Examine the challenges faced by Pakistan between 1947 and 1958.

SECTION E: EUROPE (EXCLUDING USSR)

14. Explain the factors which undermined communism in Western Europe after 1945.
15. Assess the contribution of Konrad Adenauer to Germany between 1949 and 1963.
16. To what extent was Britain's Appeasement policy responsible for the outbreak of World war II?

SECTION F: GENERAL

17. Account for the survival of the European Economic Community (EEC) since 1958.
18. Assess the role of the United Nations Organization (UNO) in maintaining peace in the World.
