Grammar: If2.

Unlike in if 1 where there's a possibility of the condition being fulfilled, in if 2 one is just imagining what would happen if the impossible came true.

In if 2, the condition cannot be fulfilled at all.

While constructing sentences in if 2, we use:

If + past simple tense of the first verb in the if clause + would.

Examples

1. He will come to the party if we invite him. (If 1)

He **would** come to the party if we invited him. (if 2)

2. If she writes well, I will be very happy. (if 1)

If she **wrote** well, I would be very happy. (if 2)

3. The girls will sweep the class if the teacher tells them. (if 1)

The girls **would** sweep the class if the teacher told them. (if 2.)

4. If my problem is solved, I will grow fat. (If 1)

If my problem was solved, I would grow fat. (if 2)
