- (b) Why were the prophets in Israel not happy with the sacrifices that the Israelites offered?
- 3. (a) Discuss the commandment of love in the book of Deuteronomy.
 - (b) What did Jesus teach on love?
- 4. Ahaz did not do what was pleasing to God, as his ancestor David had done". (2 Kings 16:2).
- (a) How did Ahaz fail to live up to the true worship of God?
- (b) Discuss Isaiah's response to Ahaz's reign.
- 5. (a) Discuss the circumstances that led to the anointing of David as King of Israel.
 - (b) How did King David fail to live up to the covenant law?
- 6. "...so David and all the house of Israel brought up the ark of the Lord with shouting and the sound of the horn". (2 Samuel 6:15 RSV).

- 9. (a) Comment on what Hosea taught about God's love for Israel.

- 10. (a) Examine the nature of Jeremiahs prophetic call and mission. (Jeremiah 1:1-19).
