Read the passage below and answer the questions that follow correctly.

In Uganda, there are three national examinations written at three different levels. All these national examinations are set by the same body called Uganda National Examinations Board(UNEB). The people who look forward to writing any of these national examinations are called candidates. In the first level of education called primary, the national examination done is known as Primary Leaving Examination (PLE). This examination prepares primary children for the next level. This is simplest of all national examination since it comprises only 4 subjects but it is again the most feared. Children fear PLE just because it is always their first national examination.

The next level of education is called secondary. This is the one that succeeds the primary level. It <u>comprises</u> two sub-levels viz; O level and A level. At O level, the national examination done is called Uganda Certificate of Education (UCE). This is a bit more complicated than PLE since it involves 10 subjects.

At A level, the national examination done is Uganda Advanced Certificate of Education (UACE). It has fewer subjects than UCE but it is the hardest of all.

All these national examinations are usually done towards the end of the year. PLE is done first followed by UCE and then later UACE comes. After the candidates have written these national examinations, the national examinations are taken to different UNEB marking centres for marking. The marking is done by different teachers <u>selected</u> by UNEB and these selected teachers are called examiners.
