Starting a woodlot

A woodlot is a piece of land where trees are grown

Factors considered when starting a woodlot

- 1. Size of land
- 2. Capital
- 3. Fertility of the soil
- 4. Labour
- 5. Security
- 6. Soil drainage

Starting a tree nursery bed.

Nursery bed

A nursery bed is a piece of land prepared for raising seedlings before they taken to a well prepared garden.

importance of raising seedlings in a nursery bed.

- 1. It protects seedlings from bad weather conditions.
- 2. It makes it easy to care for seedlings e.g. weeding, thinning, spraying etc.
- 3. Helps a farmer select quality seedlings for transplanting.

Types of Nurseries.

- 1. Nursery bed
- 2. Seed boxes
- 3. Soil blocks

Care for seedlings in the nursery bed.

1. Watering.

3. Spraying.

2. Thinning.

4. Hardening off

Factors to consider when choosing a site for a nursery bed

- 1. Soil drainage
- 2. Soil fertility
- 3. Nearness to the water source
- 4. Nearness to home or school

Steps taken when starting a nursery bed.

- a) Choose a good site, clear the land and dig deep to make the soil fine.
- b) Add manure in the nursery bed and mix it well with soil.
- c) Furrow the soil using a stick and plant the seeds you have selected.
- d) Cover the prepared area with mulches, provide a shade and water.


NB: Remove the shade when the seedlings are about to be transplanted.

Hardening off: It is the making of seedlings get used to harsh garden conditions. The garden conditions are strong rain and strong sunshine among others.

Ways of hardening off

- 1. Removing shade gradually
- 2. Reducing watering
